Note: The College of Human Ecology requires a "C" or higher in "Professional Studies" courses, and the University General Education requirements must be met by K-State courses.

Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at an accredited two-year college. * Each student must complete at least 30 K-State resident credits to be considered for a degree from K-State. Further, the student must complete 20 of the last 30 Hours of resident credit at K-State. A minimum of 45 Hours must be at a course level of 300 or above.
