

## Information for Human Ecology Students Seeking Family and Consumer Sciences Education Licensure

### FCSED

Family and Consumer Sciences Education is a teaching licensure program approved by the Kansas State Board of Education. Although students are enrolled in the Bachelor of Science Degree program in the College of Human Ecology for the duration of their undergraduate program, completion of the program is dependent upon their admission to teacher education in the College of Education. Admission to teacher education is dependent upon the fulfillment of the following requirements:

1. Minimum score of 172 in Writing, 173 in Reading, and 172 in Math on the Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) or an ACT composite score of 26 or above.
2. Successful completion of DED 075, Orientation to Teacher Education at KSU must be successfully completed.
3. Minimum of 50 credit hours completed, including all KSU and transfer credits.
4. Expository Writing I and II completed with a minimum grade of "C" in each course.
5. Public Speaking I or IA completed with a minimum grade of "C".
6. Six credit hours in Mathematics with minimum grades of "C", including College Algebra or a higher-level math course, and a statistics course (STAT 325 or above).
7. Minimum 2.5 GPA in all college work attempted, including KSU and transfer credit.
8. Minimum 2.5 GPA in all college work attempted in the teaching field, including KSU and transfer edits.
9. Completion of EDSEC 230, Early Field Experience. Provisional admission may be granted if the student is currently enrolled or pre-enrolled in the course. Successful completion of the course is required or the student will be dropped from the Teacher Education Program.

Students are recommended for a Kansas Family and Consumer Sciences Teaching License when they have:

- Completed all of the family and consumer sciences licensure requirements.
- Successfully completed the Principles of Learning and Teaching Test.
- Successfully completed the PRAXIS II content assessment test number 0121 for FACS with a passing score of 162.
- Submitted the application to the KSU College of Education Licensing Officer in Bluemont Hall 013 one month before graduation from Kansas State University

Application deadline:

To pre-enroll for Summer or Fall professional classes  
To pre-enroll for Spring professional classes

February 15

October 1

Please note that applications are accepted at any time, but the deadlines above must be met for pre-enrollment purposes.
