Note: The College of Human Ecology requires a "C" or higher in "Professional Studies" courses, and the University General Education Requirements must be met.

Admission to teacher education requires a minimum 2.5 GPA in all college work attempted (KSU and transfer credit) and a minimum 2.5 GPA in all college work attempted in the teaching field (KSU and transfer credits).

Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at an accredited two-year college.* Each student must complete at least 30 K-State resident credits to be considered for a degree from K-State. Further, the student must complete 20 of the last 30 hours of resident credit at K-State. A minimum of 45 hours must be at a course level of 300 or above.

***Maximum of 62 credits from a two-year institution.**
